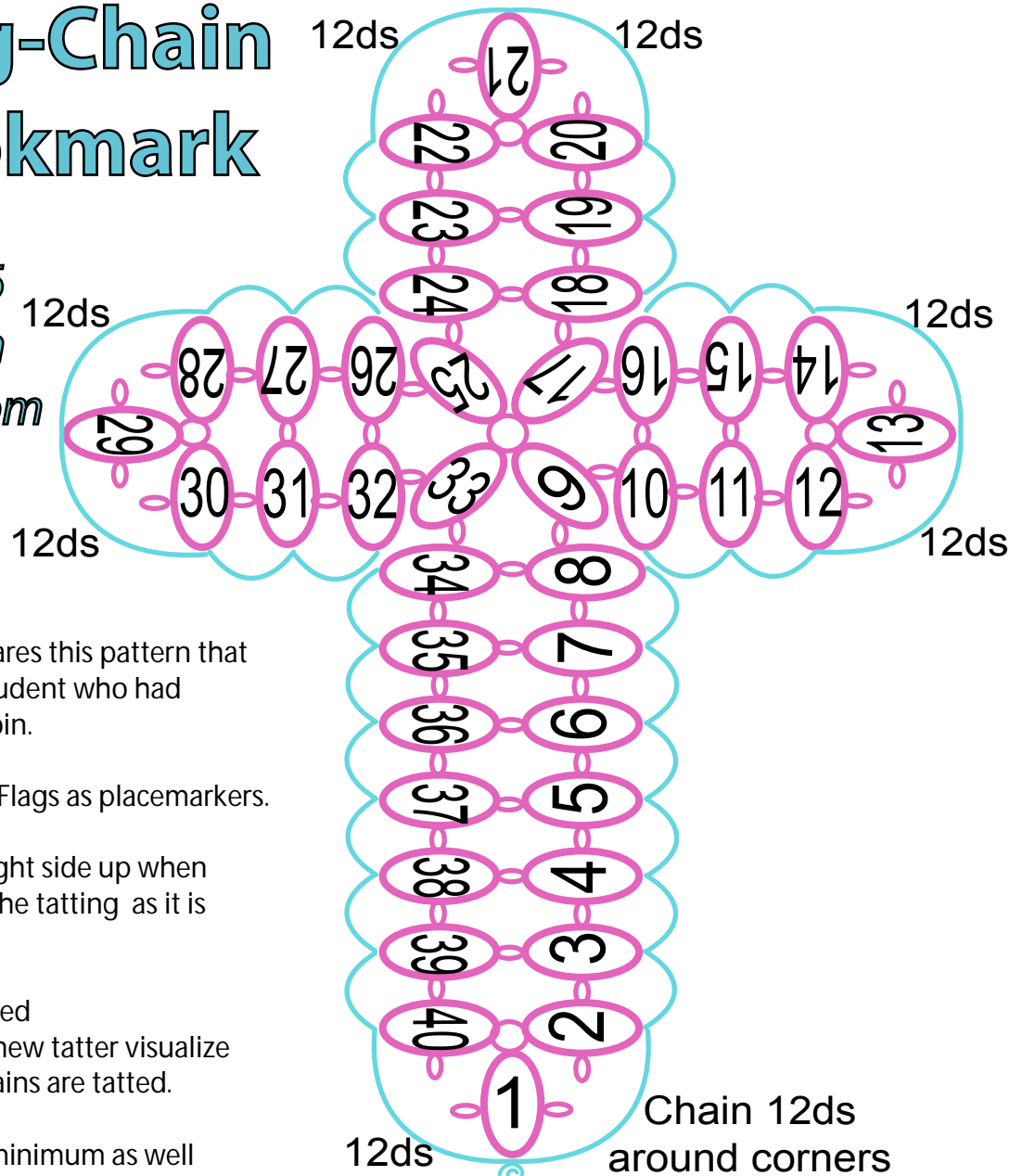


Basic Ring-Chain Cross Bookmark

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gina Butler from Oklahoma shares this pattern that she drew at the request of a student who had mastered the ring, chain and join.

Encourage the use of Post-It® Flags as placemarkers.

Notice that the numbers are right side up when you turn the design to match the tatting as it is being made.

This pattern could also be copied onto clear acetate to help the new tatter visualize the back of the work as the chains are tatted.

Keeping the stitch count to a minimum as well as tatting the chains without decorative picots, make this a project that can be completed fairly quickly.

The spiral chain is merely the second half of the double stitch.

Rings -

1st row 3+3-3-3

Joining 2nd row 3+3+3-3

Chains - 6ds

Note: Corner chains 12ds
